Student Summer Job Opportunities

The Manitoba Youth Job Centers (MYJC) open on May 20th. Centers provide community-based summer employment referral services throughout rural and northern Manitoba.

Manitoba Youth Job Centers **Youth Engagement Leader Positions** are available in Rural and Northern Manitoba. These positions provides 15 weeks of full-time employment from early May to Mid August. Applicants must have a driver's license and must register with STEP Services.

Job Squad: Rural students and youth ages 12-16 can join the **Job Squad**, a casual labor program, which provides supervised first work and volunteer experiences for youth to gain hands-on career related skills and experiences. Parent's permission is required.

STEP Applications: Students (ages 16-29) who wish to be considered for summer employment with the Provincial Government must complete their STEP applications. The types of jobs vary from year to year however some of the positions are in the area of research, clerical positions, lab assistants, park attendants.

Most of the positions are open to students in post-secondary. High school students are encouraged to apply and to indicate that they are also interested in Green Team positions. 15-year-old students are also encouraged to complete STEP applications and apply for Green Team.
